LICENSING AND PARTICIPATION

All riders in the amateur fields must possess a valid USAC or UCI license. One-day USAC licenses will be available for Category 5 (Men and Women), Juniors, Single Speed at the event for \$15. To compete in the UCI Men's and Women's fields, riders must possess a valid UCI international license. NOTE: a valid UCI license MUST be acquired pre-event. To compete in the UCI Junior Men's and Junior Women's fields, riders must possess a valid UCI international license or a USA Cycling domestic license with a UCI ID.*

A rider's 2023 racing age, according to UCI 5.1.01

The category to which the license holder belongs on 1 January of the civil year following will be used for his/her participation in events for the whole season, or in other words, a rider's racing age for all categories is determined by his/her age on December 31, 2024.

2023-24 UCI Categories by age:

Men Elite: 2005 or earlier

Women: 2007 and earlier

Men's Junior: 2006 and 2007

Women's Junior: 2006 & 2007

U-23 men and Elite Men shall ride in the same event.

Junior Men 17-18 may NOT compete in the Men's Elite competition.

Junior Women 17-18 may compete in Women's Elite competition.

On-Site Registration

Registration opens @ 6:45 a.m. each morning and closes @ 2:30 p.m. each afternoon.

Preregistered riders may pick up their numbers/check in at the pavilion. Day or registration, category changes and replacement numbers will be available at the scoring trailer located at the finish/expo area.

***Regarding the registration requirement for the UCI Men's Junior: Riders must have their date of birth, gender and citizenship/permanent resident status verified. Having verified this information, a free UCI ID is issued. If a UCI ID is not currently displayed on your license, log into your USA Cycling "My Account"**

and look for this in your Profile link. If these items are not listed or are incorrect, please do the following to update your account:

Create a copy of your Birth certificate or Passport/Permanent Resident Status (Green Card) and Mail, email (membership@usacycling.org with the subject of: UCI ID Documents for USA Cycling Member) or fax (719-434-4300) it to USA Cycling.

A UCI ID is your lifelong, internationally unique, identity number to confirm your racing status and maintain your privacy in internationally published registration and results documents.

Sign in for UCI Women, Men and Juniors will be available 10:00am until 2:30pm each day. Same bib and shoulder numbers will be used for BOTH DAYS. Riders and support staff must check in with the UCI Race Secretary prior to race start **EACH DAY.**

- Online preregistration closes Tuesday, September 12, 2023, at 11:59pm

Registration/sign-in closes **30 minutes prior to each race – NO EXCEPTIONS.** If a rider has pre-registered but has not picked up his/her bib number 30 minutes prior to race start, the promoter reserves the right to reassign the bib number to another rider. **Riders must check-in for each day of racing. SAME BIB NUMBER WILL BE USED FOR BOTH DAYS.**

PRO TEAM PARKING

Elite teams/riders may park at the Fallon Park Pool lot by reservations only. Overnight parking is allowed for reserved pro team parking. 20' x 20' (\$125) and 20' x 40' (\$200) spaces available. Register for space on [BIKEREG.COM/GOCROSS](https://www.bikerereg.com/gocross). Limited space is available. Water access if available at the pool. Please refer to course map for location.

ATHLETE FREE PARKING

Free parking is available to all UCI athletes, amateurs and spectators in the field at Fallon Park. Please be respectful of space. Water is available at the registration pavilion. Paved parking is also available at Fallon Park Elementary School.

LARGE VEHICLE & OVERFLOW PARKING (DAY ONLY)

Large vehicles may park daily in the overflow parking lot or at Fallon Park Elementary. The overflow parking lot is a large grass field located near the finish line. This lot is accessible from the intersection of Wise Ave. SE and 19th St. SE.

CLUB ROW

Limited space is available for amateur team tents inside the venue. Spaces may be purchased from [BIKEREG.COM/GOCROSS](https://www.bikerereg.com/gocross) for \$100 (10'x10').

DIRECTIONS

From Interstate 81: Take Exit 143 to I-581 S/US220 S towards Airport/Roanoke. Continue on I-581 S. Take Exit 6. In the left lane of the off ramp, turn left at light onto Elm/Bullit Ave. Bullit Ave becomes Dale Ave. Turn Left onto 19th St. into Fallon Park.

From 220 S (coming from NC): Follow US 220 N to Exit 6. Turn right at the top of the off ramp onto Elm/Bullit Ave. Bullit Ave becomes Dale Ave. Turn Left onto 19th St. into Fallon Park.

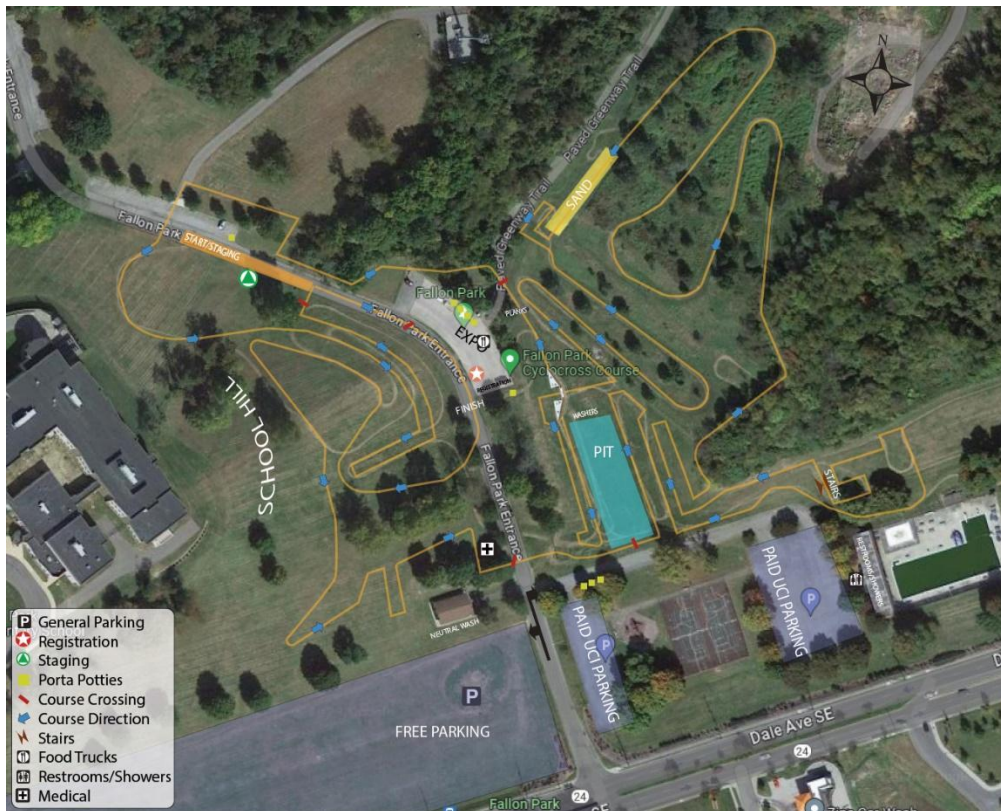
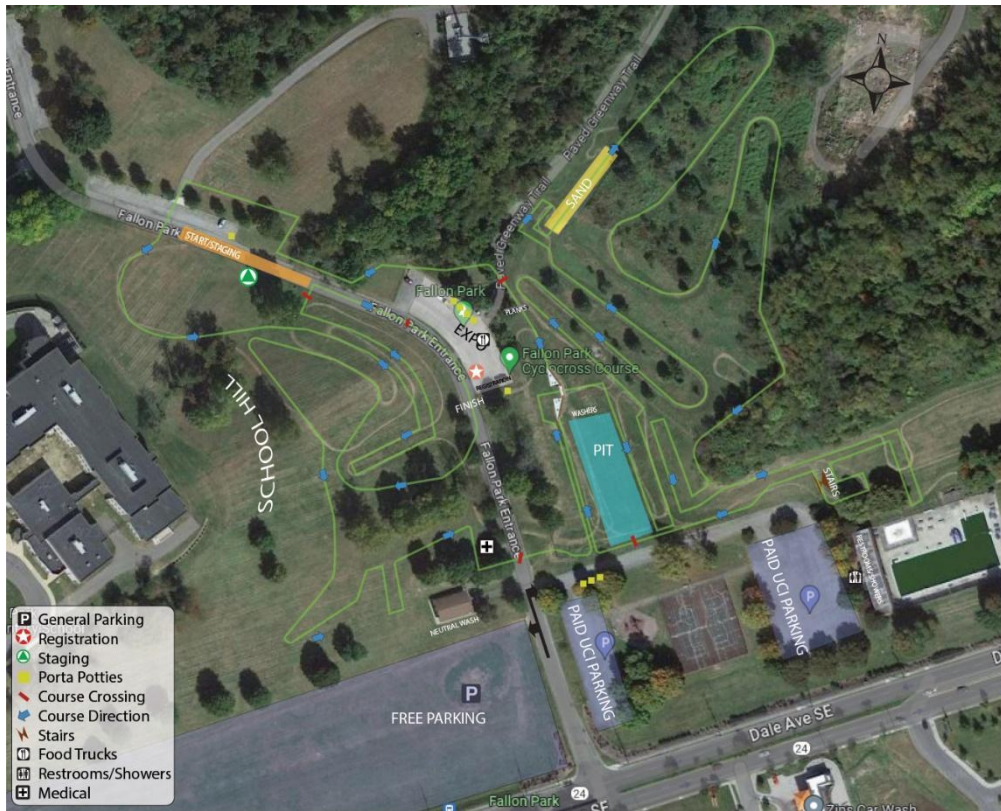
EVENT

- The 2023 Virginia's Blue Ridge GO Cross p/b Fat Tire Ale will be a UCI Class 1 for Saturday and a UCI Class 2 for Sunday.
- The first USAC sanctioned edition of GO Cross was in 2013. The event was awarded UCI C2 status in 2018, 2019 and 2021; in 2022 GO Cross was awarded C1 and C2 status.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The cyclocross course at Fallon Park features one forced run up and one run up with entrenched utility poles that may be rideable(amateurs only). One set of double planks and a sand pit are other obstacles on the course. The course is mostly grass with varying elevation and a paved start/finish. Course will be modified between Saturday (Day 1) and Sunday (Day 2). Course length is ~3.3 km.

LOCATION OF OFFICIALS, SECRETARIAT, ACCREDITATION ISSUE POINT, REGISTRATIION & PRESS/MEDIA TENTS

- The OFFICIALS area is located adjacent to the FINISH line on a raised platform.
- The SECRETARIAT and PRESS/MEDIA area is located within the silver scoring trailer.

- The ACCREDITATION issue point and REGISTRATION (packet pickup/check in) is located in the silver trailer in the Race Expo.

TIMING, SCORING AND RESULTS

Timing and scoring will be done using a computer program by our timing staff. In addition to the staff and computer program, a high-speed camera will also be present at the finish line. The timing equipment and staff will be in the officials' tent on a custom raised platform immediately adjacent to the finish line and truss. UCI Elite races will also use chip timing to ensure accurate timing splits for GCN.

Timing Chips must be returned after the rider's final race of the weekend.

Results will be posted on the results board near the podium in the Expo area. Results will also be emailed following each race.

RACE NUMBERS

Proper number placement is crucial for correct scoring and accurate results.

Bib numbers must clearly be displayed and properly placed. Riders will be provided with an example of correct bib placement at registration.

Riders with long hair must be sure their number is not obscured.

Shoulder numbers shall be oriented forward facing.

DO not fold or cut bib numbers. Riders with improperly pinned numbers will be sent to the back of the starting grid unless they are corrected.

SAME NUMBER WILL BE REUSED FOR BOTH DAYS, DO NOT LOSE YOUR NUMBER.

EQUIPMENT REGULATIONS

Approved helmets required for all riders.

Riders in the amateur races may ride cyclocross or mountain bikes, provided bar ends are removed. No tire width restrictions for USAC amateur races.

UCI Cyclocross rules have the following equipment requirements:

- Tire width is reduced to a maximum of 33 mm for UCI events.
- No flat bars
- Feeding is not permitted during the race. However, bicycles and spare bicycles may have a water bottle on the frame.

START ORDER**Amateur Races:**

Riders are advised to be in vicinity of Start Staging Area at least 15 minutes prior to race start time.

Rider call ups/start grid position will be done **for preregistered riders only** based on top five 2022 USCX final standings and then Crossresults.com standings. If riders are not present within 10 minutes to start and miss their call up, they will lose their start grid position. Concerns about start order should be addressed with the Registrar no less than 30 minutes before the start of the respective event. Riders registering day of will fill in behind. **SAME BIB NUMBER WILL BE USED FOR BOTH DAYS.**

UCI Races:

Rider call ups will begin about 10 minutes before race start. Riders not present who miss their call up will lose their start grid position. Call ups will be in a generally numeric order for Day 1. Riders with randomized numbers on Day 2 may have a different start grid position.

The start order is determined:

- 1) Per the latest published individual UCI Cyclocross Classification
- 2) Unclassified riders by random draw established by the commissaires

Confirm your ranking points with the Race Secretary when you pick up your number or check in each day. Upon entering the starting grid, race officials will be checking the placement of your numbers and the width of your tires. **SAME BIB NUMBER WILL BE USED FOR BOTH DAYS.**

PIT REQUIREMENTS

Each UCI rider is allowed two mechanics and one paramedical assistant. Each rider will be issued up to 3 pit passes with their corresponding rider numbers at sign-in. No other personnel shall be allowed in the Pit Zone. Anyone receiving a pit pass must show a USAC/UCI license and have it recorded with the number of the rider(s) they are supporting. (NOTE: any valid USAC/UCI license is acceptable, except one-day licenses)

Race staff will provide pit pass badges or wristbands prior to packet pick up at sign-in. All credentials **MUST** be picked up 1 hour prior to the start of the race. Race staff and officials will check for credentials in the pit and any individual found without proper credentials will be asked to leave the pit area.

Two powered pressure washers will be available for UCI races on-site in the pit area.

For Saturday's C1 UCI races, pit box assignments will be randomly allocated by the Commissaires for each team or rider's mechanics as per UCI 5.1.036 bis.

FEEDING

Riders may not take food or beverages offered by spectators from the beer garden/food court or any other places on the course. Doing so may result in disqualification.

LAPPED RIDERS

Please be courteous and move to the side when being lapped, do not contest or interfere. The Chief Referee can and will pull lapped riders, but it is our intent to allow all riders to finish each event. For the Men's and Women's UCI events, the 80% rule may be applied at the President's discretion.

Target Finish Bell per USAC 4H1(d) option for USAC events & the UCI Junior Women's and Men's races:

- ___ Lapped riders will be left in the race but are not to interfere with the leaders on course.
- ___ The lap cards will change to 1 lap-to-go based on (the scheduled time of the race)-(the average lap time X 1.3).
- ___ Some riders may see the cards change from 3-to-go to 1-to-go and will get the bell before the leaders on the course.
- ___ Riders caught by riders who got the bell will finish when the lap cards display 0 laps-to-go.
- ___ Riders are placed by time if on the same lap as the leaders, or "@ Laps Incomplete" if they do not complete the full race distance.
- Riders abandoning will be listed as DNF in the results.

EVENT MEDICAL STAFF

Local ambulance services and the county sheriff have been informed of the event. An ambulance will be on standby within the park for the treatment of minor injuries for athletes, staff and spectators. First aid will be available in the medical area located within the EVENT HQ. At least one doctor and 2 trained first aid providers will be on course.

ANTI-DOPING

GO Cross is subject to UCI/USADA anti-doping examination regulations and all competitors and team personnel must abide by these regulations. Any riders with a nonnegative test result (following any adjudication process) will forfeit any prizes won at the event.

Anti-doping control will be located near the registration pavilion. The list of riders required to report will be posted on the results board prior to the finish of the race. The racers will be required to report to anti-doping control within 30 minutes of the race finish.

It is the responsibility of the rider and/or his/her team personnel to ensure that he/she reports to anti-doping within the required time.

PODIUM ETIQUETTE AND CHANGING AREA

Immediately following the completion of each race on both September 17th and 18th, the top 3 riders must proceed to the podium area. This includes ALL amateur and UCI events. The podium area is within expo area, next to the Virginia's Blue Ridge tent. **The top three finishers must report for awards, podium pictures and potential interviews with the announcer.**

Riders are advised to have podium bags ready prior to the race (a podium bag typically contains a clean jersey and any essentials to prepare for awards and photos). If riders have support staff, they may assist their rider in the changing/preparing. There will be a “UCI Awards Prep” tent located near the podium.

AWARDS CEREMONY PROTOCOL

The riders that must report to the podium are the Race Winner, 2nd and 3rd place.

Note that failure to attend awards ceremonies results in **500CHF for a C1 event and 100CHF for C2 event** (UCI 5.6.004.15).

- UCI awards podium ceremonies will be held immediately, but no later than 15 minutes, after the finish of each race on both days.
- There will be a podium for 1st ME U23 Rider & 1st WE U23 Riders each day (immediately following the UCI Men’s Elite awards and the UCI Women’s Elite awards).
- Amateur awards podiums will be held approximately 15 minutes after the completion of each race on both days.

POST EVENT PRESS CONFERENCE (UCI RIDERS ONLY)

Top 3 athletes should go straight from the Awards Ceremony to the Press Conference. The Press Conference and interviews will be held at the podium area briefly after their ceremony for potential interviews. Riders should then report to anti-doping if required.

AMATEUR PRIZE LIST

The top 3 finishers of each amateur category will receive the traditional GO Cross branded medals at the podium ceremony.

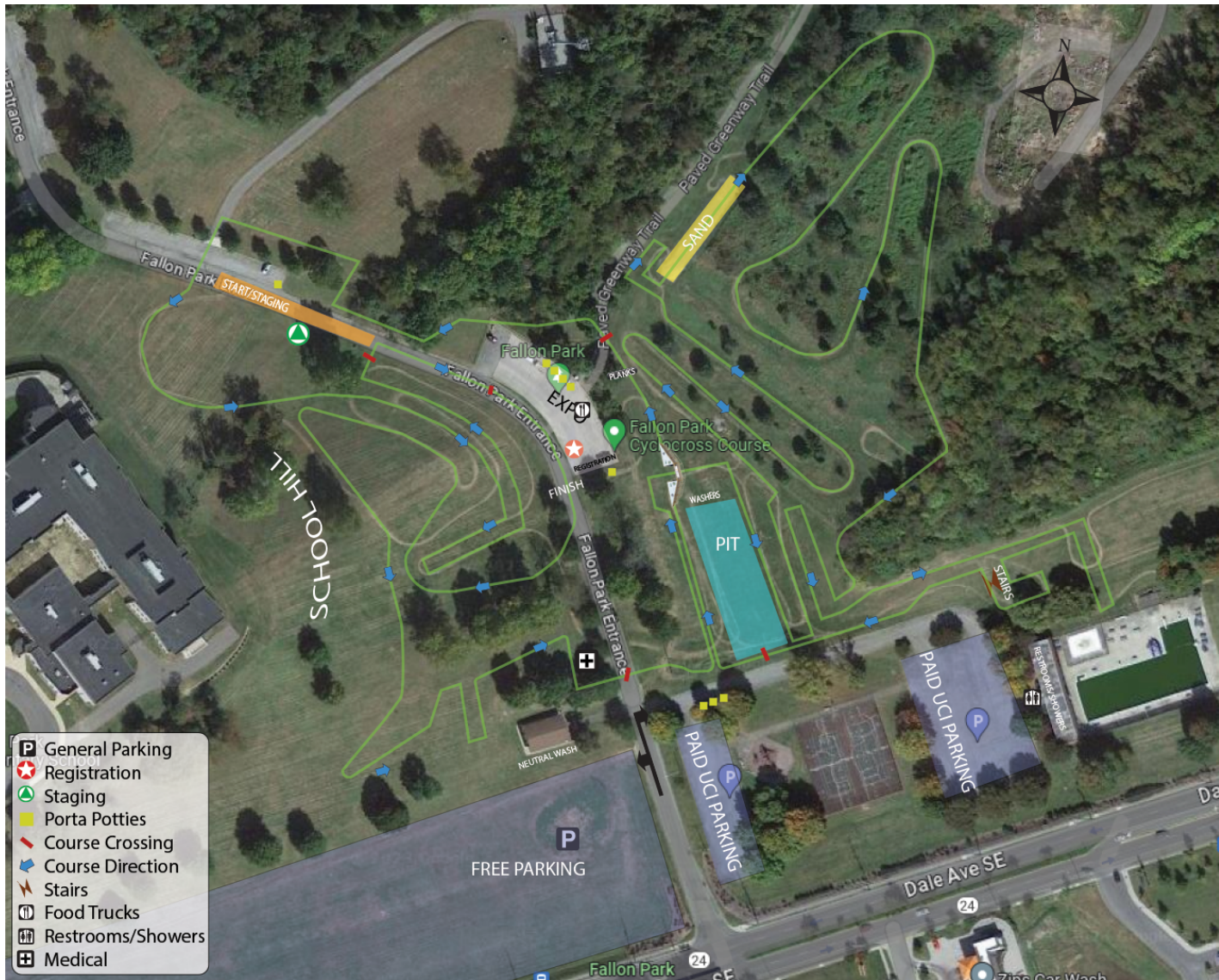

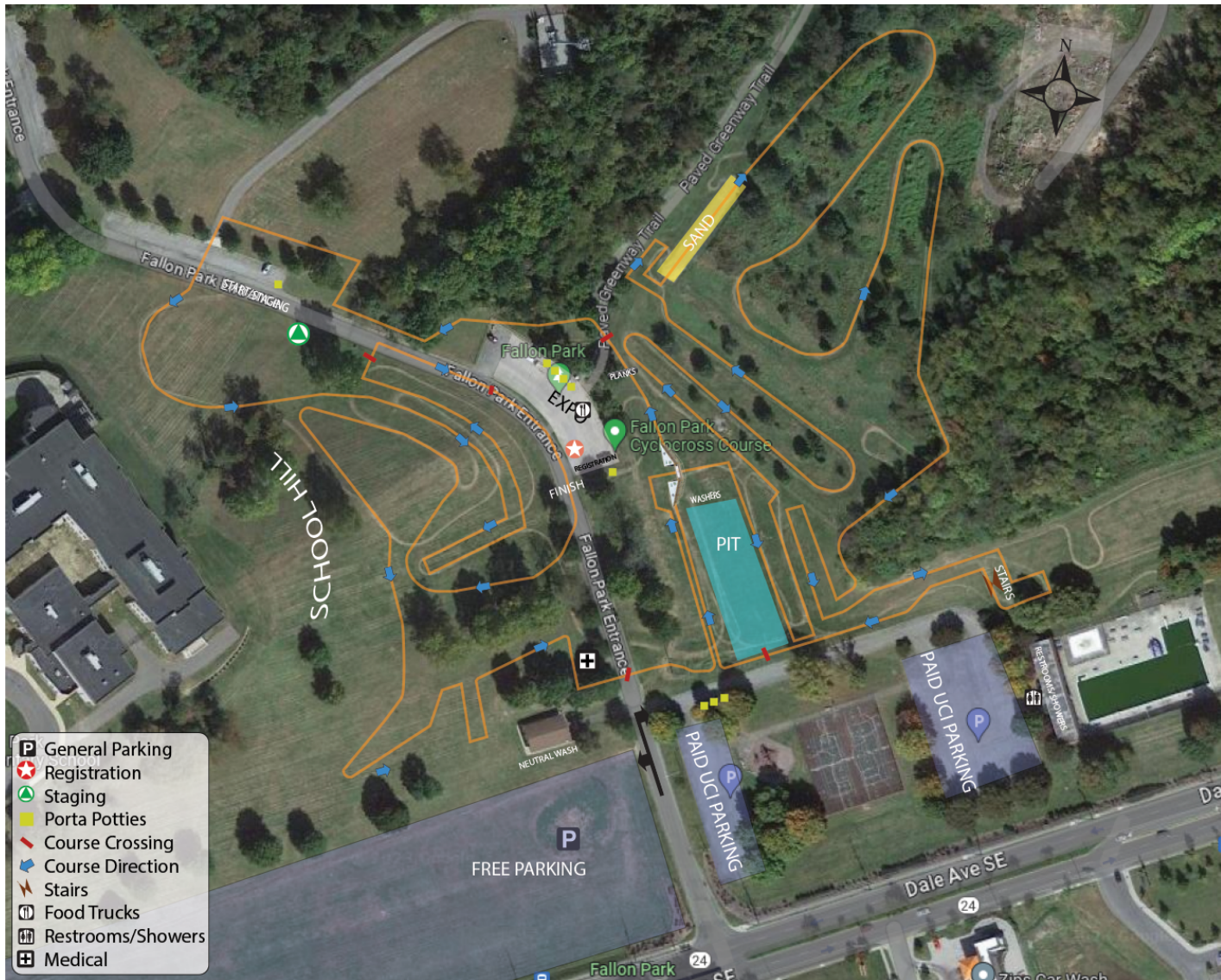

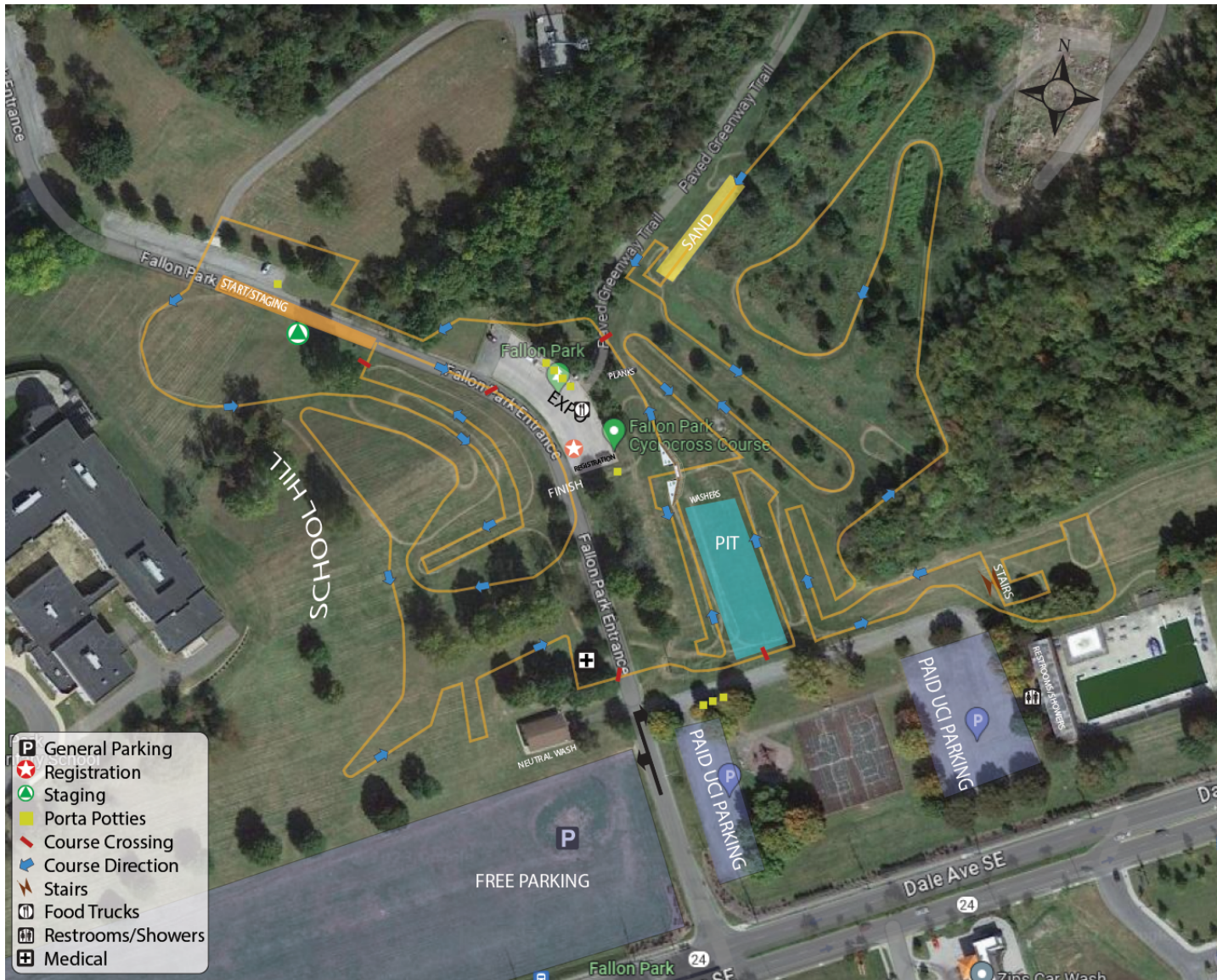
